



Roy Robinson

MA, Dip Perf RCM, ARCM (P), ARCM (T), LRAM (T), LTCL (P)



Prize-winning viola player and pianist, Roy trained as a performer at the Royal College of Music where he won the Leslie Alexander prize, the highest award available on the viola. A dual first study viola pupil of Frederick Riddle and piano pupil of Angus Morrison, he holds a complete suite of performing and teaching diplomas on piano and viola, plus performing diploma on violin and an MA in music. He also has a background as an organist, conductor, and published composer, as well as vast experience as a choral trainer.

Roy has spent most of his career combining performing, teaching, examining and adjudicating. He has taught academic music to A Level, the piano, violin and viola to diploma level, and the violin to RAM Exhibitioners; he currently delivers termly piano diploma masterclasses in Brighton. He has organised and coached over 50 orchestral and singing courses and festivals for children, some under the umbrella of SATIPS, and has coached and conducted many adult choral societies concerts. He has arranged and composed countless pieces for choirs and instrumental combinations with several of his works published by Subject Publications. Following appointments in various independent schools, mostly as Director of Music, he has now returned to freelance life.

He has extensive experience as a performer, including playing viola and piano in orchestras and ensembles and as a solo recitalist, most recently playing 2 piano recitals. He has particularly enjoyed several long lasting piano duet partnerships, largely playing to music club audiences across the south. A former official accompanist to Cheltenham Bach Choir under Brian Kay, he performed on TV and broadcast on the radio; he was also frequent concert accompanist (and occasional conductor) to Bournemouth Sinfonietta Choir, as well as other choirs across the south.

As a busy ABRSM examiner, he has worked all over the world delivering grade, jazz and diploma exams, including some in German. He has also engaged in other work for ABRSM, including viola consultant, viola syllabus selector and presenter of teacher meetings.

As a longstanding adjudicator member of the British Federation of Music Festivals, Roy brings wide experience of performing and teaching to encourage, support and inspire progress and development. He not only enjoys adjudicating his specialist areas, but also the complete range of classes as a generalist: he is listed as GEN which means he is qualified to adjudicate all classes.

Away from music, he can often be found driving one of his classic cars, playing croquet, gardening or baking cakes!

USE OF COPIES IN VOCAL CLASSES – NOW PERMITTED IN ALL CLASSES

The committee has adopted an inclusion policy to encourage entrants who may feel inhibited by the need to memorise their songs. Although encouraged to sing from memory, this is not compulsory and no additional marks will be awarded. However the score may inhibit the communication of the performance and this may be reflected in the marks given. **This applies to all vocal classes.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS

In **Solo Classes**, a vocalist must keep strictly to one classified voice throughout the festival, ie a soprano in one solo competition may not enter as a mezzo-soprano or contralto in any other solo competition.

No person may compete more than once for a trophy in the Music sessions unless that trophy is offered for the best entry in several classes (the exceptions being musical composition classes and certain other classes where special conditions are mentioned).

In 'Own Choice' ensemble classes a competitor may be allowed to compete more than once providing the piece sung/played is different.

Conductors are not permitted to sing **whilst conducting** with any choir or group.

In classes where a time limit is stated, competitors will either be disqualified or have marks deducted if the time limit is exceeded.

All senior ensemble classes must have 80% of members over the age of 18.

SESSION NOTES

Competitors must provide their own accompanists.

We will have 5 music stands available for competitors.

Competitors are asked to arrange their own page turners, although there will usually be someone available.

In all junior and ensemble classes, please could all teachers and responsible adults ensure that backstage noise is kept to a minimum and ensure that all the dressing room doors are kept closed whilst other competitors are performing.

Competitors using props must be responsible for clearing the stage and the dressing rooms at the end of their classes.

The Festival organisers reserve the right to start at earlier or later times than those published in the programme.

Competitors should arrive at least 15 minutes before the start of the class and should make themselves known to the steward in attendance.

Any competitors who are unable to perform on the day must advise the Executive Officer before the start of the session.

Minors are the responsibility of their Parent, Guardian or Teacher at all times. Eisteddfod Guernsey accepts no responsibility for unaccompanied children who leave the theatre.

Only competitors and authorised officials are permitted on stage or in the wings during competitions.

To qualify for the award, competitors must have competed in at least three of the classes, including Classe Superieure. The average will be calculated on their Classe Superieure songs and the two highest marks from their other work. To receive the cup, competitors must have attained an average of 85 (plus) marks. Folk, Old Familiar, Operetta, Gilbert & Sullivan and Stage Show classes are not eligible for this award.

THE JANET BRAN CUP

This cup to be awarded to the singer in the Junior Section who, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, shows MOST PROMISE.

THE MARJORIE GUILLETTE CUP

This cup to be awarded to the pianist in the Junior Section who, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, shows MOST PROMISE.

THE FREEMAN CUP AND AWARD

A Voucher and an Oxford Dictionary of Music
To be awarded to the string player in the Junior Section who, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, shows MOST PROMISE.

THE E H BODMAN TROPHY

This trophy to be awarded to the Woodwind or Brass player in the Junior Section who, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, shows MOST PROMISE.

THE JUNE BOURGET TROPHY

This cup to be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator to the most outstanding choir in either the Junior or Senior sections.

THE MIRIAM R LE PAGE PRIX D'HONNEUR TROPHY

This award to be presented for the most memorable performance, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, during the whole of the Music Section.

THE ADJUDICATOR'S CUP

This cup to be awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator to any competitor/competitors.

THE PETER A MALLEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy to be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to anyone who has entered into the spirit of the Eisteddfod by offering support to our Festival in a competitive and/or non-competitive way.

THE RICHARD DE LA RUE TROPHY

THE MILDRED BOND MEMORIAL CUP FOR ACCOMPANIST OF THE YEAR


